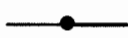

AN ACT to amend and reenact section seven, article sixteen, chapter thirty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to the fee for renewal of a chiropractic license and to requirements for continuing chiropractic education.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That section seven, article sixteen, chapter thirty of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 16. CHIROPRACTORS.**

**§30-16-7. License; annual renewal fee; effect of failure to renew; reinstatement.**

1 All holders of certificates of license to practice  
2 chiropractic in this state shall renew them annually on  
3 or before the first day of July of each year: (1) By  
4 paying the board an annual renewal fee not exceeding  
5 one hundred dollars as determined by the board; and

6 (2) by presenting to the board evidence of attendance  
7 of at least twelve classroom hours of continuing  
8 education each year. The West Virginia board of  
9 chiropractic examiners shall approve the fulfillment of  
10 the continuing education requirement. The board shall  
11 notify each certificate holder by mail, at least thirty  
12 days prior to the first day of July of each year, of the  
13 necessity of renewing his or her certificate. The first  
14 annual renewal fee shall be due on the first day of  
15 July, one thousand nine hundred sixty-five.

16 The failure to renew a certificate of license to  
17 practice chiropractic shall operate as an automatic  
18 suspension of the rights and privileges granted by its  
19 issuance.

20 A certificate of license suspended by a failure to  
21 make an annual renewal may be reinstated by the  
22 board upon presentation of evidence of attendance of  
23 at least twelve classroom hours of continuing  
24 education for each year such license has been  
25 suspended; payment of all fees that would have been  
26 paid had the certificate holder maintained his certifi-  
27 cate in good standing and the payment to the board of  
28 a reinstatement fee of not to exceed fifty dollars as  
29 determined by the board; but no certificate shall be  
30 reinstated after a lapse of three years. After a lapse of  
31 three years, license may be issued only after the  
32 former certificate holder subsequent to said lapse has  
33 passed the examination provided for in this article.
