Senate Bill No. 51

(BY SENATORS WOOTON, DALTON, PLYMALE AND WAGNER)

[Passed March 1, 1993; in effect from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact section one, article two, chapter one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to apportionment of the Senate; and making technical corrections to senatorial districts to reflect the intent of the Legislature in its original reenactment of this section in one thousand nine hundred ninety-one.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section one, article two, chapter one of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. APPORTIONMENT OF REPRESENTATION.

§1-2-1. Senatorial districts.

1 (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as
2 "The Senate Redistricting Act of 1991".

3 (b) As used in this section:

4 (1) "County" means the territory comprising a
5 county of this state as such county existed on the first
6 day of January, one thousand nine hundred ninety,
7 notwithstanding any boundary changes thereof made
8 subsequent thereto;

9 (2) "Block", "block group", "census tract" and
10 "voting district" mean those geographic areas as
11 defined by the bureau of the census of the United
12 States department of commerce for the taking of the
13 one thousand nine hundred ninety census of popula-
14 tion and described on census maps prepared by the
15 bureau of the census. Such maps are, at the time of
16 this enactment, maintained by the bureau of the
17 census and filed in the office of legislative services;

18 (3) "Magisterial district" means the territory com-
19 prising a magisterial district of this state as reported to
20 and used by the bureau of the census of the United
21 States department of commerce for the taking of the
22 one thousand nine hundred ninety census of popula-
23 tion and described on census maps prepared by the
24 bureau of the census; and

25 (4) "Incumbent senator" means a senator elected at
26 the general election held in the year one thousand
27 nine hundred ninety or at any general election there-
28 after, with an unexpired term of at least two years in
29 duration.

30 (c) The Legislature recognizes that in dividing the
31 state into senatorial districts, the Legislature is bound
32 not only by the United States constitution but also by
33 the West Virginia constitution; that in any instance
34 where the West Virginia constitution conflicts with the
35 United States constitution, the United States constitu-
36 tion must govern and control, as recognized in section
37 one, article one of the West Virginia constitution; that
38 the United States constitution, as interpreted by the
39 United States supreme court and other federal courts,
40 requires state legislatures to be apportioned so as to
41 achieve equality of population as near as is practicable,
42 population disparities being permissible where justi-
43 fied by rational state policies; and that the West
44 Virginia constitution requires two senators to be
45 elected from each senatorial district for terms of four
46 years each, one such senator being elected every two
47 years, with one half of the senators being elected
48 biennially, and requires senatorial districts to be
49 compact, formed of contiguous territory and bounded

50 by county lines. The Legislature finds and declares
51 that it is not possible to divide the state into senatorial
52 districts so as to achieve equality of population as near
53 as is practicable as required by the United States
54 supreme court and other federal courts and at the
55 same time adhere to all of these provisions of the West
56 Virginia constitution; but that, in an effort to adhere
57 as closely as possible to all of these provisions of the
58 West Virginia constitution, the Legislature, in dividing
59 the state into senatorial districts, as described and
60 constituted in subsection (d) hereof, has:

61 (1) Adhered to the equality of population concept,
62 while at the same time recognizing that from the
63 formation of this state in the year one thousand eight
64 hundred sixty-three, each constitution of West Virgi-
65 nia and the statutes enacted by the Legislature have
66 recognized political subdivision lines and many func-
67 tions, policies and programs of government have been
68 implemented along political subdivision lines;

69 (2) Made the senatorial districts as compact as
70 possible, consistent with the equality of population
71 concept;

72 (3) Formed the senatorial districts of "contiguous
73 territory" as that term has been construed and applied
74 by the West Virginia supreme court of appeals;

75 (4) Deviated from the long-established state policy,
76 recognized in subdivision (1) above, by crossing county
77 lines only when necessary to ensure that all senatorial
78 districts were formed of contiguous territory or when
79 adherence to county lines produced unacceptable
80 population inequalities and only to the extent neces-
81 sary in order to maintain contiguity of territory and to
82 achieve acceptable equality of population; and

83 (5) Also taken into account in crossing county lines,
84 to the extent feasible, the community of interests of
85 the people involved.

86 (d) The Senate shall be composed of thirty-four
87 senators, one senator to be elected at the general
88 election to be held in the year one thousand nine

89 hundred ninety-two, and biennially thereafter for a
90 four-year term from each of the senatorial districts
91 hereinafter in this subsection described and constitut-
92 ed as follows:

93 (1) The counties of Brooke and Hancock and all of
94 magisterial District One of Ohio county and voting
95 district EP 9, voting district EP 20, voting district EP
96 28, voting district EP 31, voting district EP 113, voting
97 district EP 115, voting district EP 116, voting district
98 EP 119, voting district EP 120, Block 302D and Block
99 320 of Block Group 3 in Census Tract 0002 contained in
100 voting district EP 24, Block 405B, Block 422 and Block

123 not included in the first senatorial district and voting
124 district EP 66, voting district EP 70, voting district EP
125 72, voting district EP 74 and voting district EP 78 of the
126 West Augusta magisterial district of the county of
127 Marion shall constitute the second senatorial district;

128 (3) The counties of Calhoun, Pleasants, Wirt and
129 Wood shall constitute the third senatorial district;

130 (4) The counties of Jackson, Mason, Putnam and
131 Roane shall constitute the fourth senatorial district;

132 (5) The county of Cabell and voting district EP 12,
133 voting district VTD 101, Block 103 of Block Group 1 in
134 Census Tract 0202 contained in voting district EP 11,
135 Block 199B of Block Group 1 in Census Tract 0202
136 contained in voting district EP 59, and Block 101B and
137 Block 199E of Block Group 1 in Census Tract 0202

230 sixth senatorial district, and voting district EP 68,
231 voting district EP 72 and voting district EP 74 of the

384 (15) The counties of Hampshire, Hardy, Randolph,
385 Pendleton, Pocahontas and Upshur and that portion of
386 the county of Grant not included in the fourteenth
387 senatorial district, and that portion of the county of
388 Mineral county not included in the fourteenth senator-
389 ial district shall constitute the fifteenth senatorial
390 district;

391 (16) The counties of Berkeley, Jefferson and Morgan
392 shall constitute the sixteenth senatorial district; and

393 (17) The county of Kanawha shall constitute the
394 seventeenth senatorial district.

395 (e) The West Virginia constitution further provides,
396 in section four, article VI thereof, that where a
397 senatorial district is composed of more than one
398 county, both senators for such district shall not be
399 chosen from the same county, a residency dispersal
400 provision which is clear with respect to senatorial
401 districts which follow county lines, as required by such
402 constitution, but which is not clear in application with
403 respect to senatorial districts which cross county lines.
404 However, in an effort to adhere as closely as possible
405 to the West Virginia constitution in this regard, the
406 following additional provisions, in furtherance of the
407 rationale of such residency dispersal provision and to
408 give meaning and effect thereto, are hereby
409 established:

410 (1) With respect to a senatorial district which is
411 composed of one or more whole counties and one or
412 more parts of another county or counties, no more
413 than one senator shall be chosen from the same
414 county or part of a county to represent such senatorial
415 district;

416 (2) With respect to a senatorial district which does

417 not contain any whole county but only parts of two or
418 more counties, no more than one senator shall be
419 chosen from the same part to represent such senator-
420 ial district; and

421 (3) With respect to superimposed senatorial districts
422 which contain only one whole county, all senators
423 shall be chosen from such county to represent such
424 senatorial districts.

425 (f) Candidates for the Senate shall be nominated as
426 provided in section four, article five, chapter three of
427 this code, except that such candidates shall be nomi-
428 nated in accordance with the residency dispersal
429 provisions specified in section four, article VI of the
430 West Virginia constitution and the additional residency
431 dispersal provisions specified in subsection (e) hereof.
432 Candidates for the Senate shall also be elected in
433 accordance with the residency dispersal provisions
434 specified in said section four, article VI of the West
435 Virginia constitution and the additional residency
436 dispersal provisions specified in subsection (e) hereof.
437 In furtherance of the foregoing provisions of this
438 subsection, no person may file a certificate of candi-
439 dacy for election from a senatorial district described
440 and constituted in subsection (d) hereof if he or she
441 resides in the same county and the same such senator-
442 ial district wherein also resides an incumbent senator,
443 whether the senatorial district wherein such incum-
444 bent senator resides was described and constituted by
445 chapter ninety-nine, acts of the Legislature, one
446 thousand nine hundred eighty-two, or was described
447 and constituted in subsection (d) of this section or its
448 immediately prior reenactment. Any vacancy in a
449 nomination shall be filled, any appointment to fill a
450 vacancy in the Senate shall be made, and any candi-
451 dates in an election to fill a vacancy in the Senate shall
452 be chosen, so as to be consistent with the residency
453 dispersal provisions specified in section four, article VI
454 of the West Virginia constitution and the additional
455 residency dispersal provisions specified in subsection


457 (g) Regardless of the changes in senatorial district


458 boundaries made by the provisions of subsection (d)
459 hereof, all senators elected at the general election held
460 in the year one thousand nine hundred eighty-eight
461 and at the general election held in the year one
462 thousand nine hundred ninety shall continue to hold
463 their seats as members of the Senate for the term, and
464 as representatives of the senatorial district, for which
465 each thereof, respectively, was elected. Any appoint-
466 ment made or election held to fill a vacancy in the
467 Senate shall be for the remainder of the term, and as
468 a representative of the senatorial district, for which
469 the vacating senator was elected or appointed, and any
470 such election shall be held in the district as the same
471 was described and constituted at the time the vacating
472 senator was elected or appointed.

473 (h) The secretary of state may promulgate rules and
474 regulations to implement the provisions of this section,
475 including emergency rules and regulations promulgat-
476 ed pursuant to the provisions of section five, article
477 three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code.

478 (i) In amending and reenacting this section, it is not
479 the intention of the Legislature to alter or change the
480 arrangement of the senatorial districts and the appor-
481 tionment of senators as they were intended to be
482 adopted in the prior enactment of this section subse-
483 quent to the United States census for the year one
484 thousand nine hundred ninety, nor does this reenact-
485 ment alter or change such arrangement and appor-
486 tionment. Rather, it is the intent of the Legislature in
487 amending this section to incorporate all the necessary
488 geographic areas which should have been included in
489 each senatorial district, such amendment being the
490 inclusion of two voting districts which were inadvert-
491 ently omitted from one senatorial district, which
492 inclusion does not alter or change the boundaries of
493 that district.




