AN ACT to amend and reenact section three, article one, chapter forty-nine of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, relating to child welfare services; and redefining the term "legal guardianship" for purposes of abuse and neglect proceedings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That section three, article one, chapter forty-nine of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1. PURPOSES; DEFINITIONS.

§49-1-3. Definitions relating to abuse and neglect.

- 1 (a) "Abused child" means a child whose health or 2 welfare is harmed or threatened by:
- 3 (1) A parent, guardian or custodian who knowingly or
- 4 intentionally inflicts, attempts to inflict or knowingly
- 5 allows another person to inflict, physical injury or mental
- 6 or emotional injury, upon the child or another child in the
- 7 home; or
- 8 (2) Sexual abuse or sexual exploitation; or
- 9 (3) The sale or attempted sale of a child by a parent,
- 10 guardian or custodian in violation of section sixteen,
- 11 article four, chapter forty-eight of this code.
- 12 In addition to its broader meaning, physical injury may
- 13 include an injury to the child as a result of excessive
- 14 corporal punishment.
- 15 (b) "Abusing parent" means a parent, guardian or other
- 16 custodian, regardless of his or her age, whose conduct, as
- 17 alleged in the petition charging child abuse or neglect, has
- 18 been adjudged by the court to constitute child abuse or
- 19 neglect.
- 20 (c) "Child abuse and neglect" or "child abuse or neglect"
- 21 means physical injury, mental or emotional injury, sexual
- 22 abuse, sexual exploitation, sale or attempted sale or
- 23 negligent treatment or maltreatment of a child by a
- 24 parent, guardian or custodian who is responsible for the
- 25 child's welfare, under circumstances which harm or
- 26 threaten the health and welfare of the child.
- 27 (d) "Child abuse and neglect services" means social
- 28 services which are directed toward:
- 29 (1) Protecting and promoting the welfare of children who
- 30 are abused or neglected;
- 31 (2) Identifying, preventing and remedying conditions
- 32 which cause child abuse and neglect;
- 33 (3) Preventing the unnecessary removal of children from
- 34 their families by identifying family problems and assisting

- 35 families in resolving problems which could lead to a
- 36 removal of children and a breakup of the family;
- 37 (4) In cases where children have been removed from their
- 38 families, providing services to the children and the fami-
- 39 lies so as to reunify such children with their families;
- 40 (5) Placing children in suitable adoptive homes when
- 41 reunifying the children with their families is not possible
- 42 or appropriate; and
- 43 (6) Assuring the adequate care of children who have been
- 44 placed in the custody of the department or third parties.
- 45 (e) "Imminent danger to the physical well-being of the
- 46 child" means an emergency situation in which the welfare
- 47 or the life of the child is threatened. Such emergency
- 48 situation exists when there is reasonable cause to believe
- 49 that any child in the home is or has been sexually abused
- 50 or sexually exploited, or reasonable cause to believe that
- 51 the following conditions threaten the health or life of any
- 52 child in the home:
- 53 (1) Nonaccidental trauma inflicted by a parent, guard-54 ian, custodian, sibling or a babysitter or other caretaker;
- 55 (2) A combination of physical and other signs indicating
- 56 a pattern of abuse which may be medically diagnosed as
- 57 battered child syndrome;
- 58 (3) Nutritional deprivation;
- 59 (4) Abandonment by the parent, guardian or custodian;
- 60 (5) Inadequate treatment of serious illness or disease;
- 61 (6) Substantial emotional injury inflicted by a parent,
- 62 guardian or custodian; or
- 63 (7) Sale or attempted sale of the child by the parent,
- 64 guardian or custodian.
- 65 (f) "Legal guardianship" means the permanent relation-
- 66 ship between a child and caretaker, established by order of
- 67 the circuit court having jurisdiction over the child, pursu-
- 68 ant to the provisions of chapters forty-eight and forty-nine
- 69 of this code.

- 70 (g) "Multidisciplinary team" means a group of professionals and paraprofessionals representing a variety of 71 72 disciplines who interact and coordinate their efforts to identify, diagnose and treat specific cases of child abuse and neglect. Multidisciplinary teams may include, but are 74 not limited to, medical, educational, child care and 75 76 law-enforcement personnel, social workers, psychologists and psychiatrists. Their goal is to pool their respective 77 78 skills in order to formulate accurate diagnoses and to provide comprehensive coordinated treatment with 80 continuity and follow-up for both parents and children. "Community team" means a multidisciplinary group 81 which addresses the general problem of child abuse and 82 83 neglect in a given community and may consist of several 84 multidisciplinary teams with different functions.
- 85 (h) (1) "Neglected child" means a child:
- 86 (A) Whose physical or mental health is harmed or 87 threatened by a present refusal, failure or inability of the 88 child's parent, guardian or custodian to supply the child 89 withnecessary food, clothing, shelter, supervision, medical 90 care or education, when such refusal, failure or inability is 91 not due primarily to a lack of financial means on the part 92 of the parent, guardian or custodian; or
- 93 (B) Who is presently without necessary food, clothing, 94 shelter, medical care, education or supervision because of 95 the disappearance or absence of the child's parent or 96 custodian:
- 97 (2) "Neglected child" does not mean a child whose 98 education is conducted within the provisions of section 99 one, article eight, chapter eighteen of this code.
- 100 (i) "Parenting skills" means a parent's competencies in 101 providing physical care, protection, supervision and 102 psychological support appropriate to a child's age and 103 state of development.
- 104 (j) "Sexual abuse" means:
- 105 (A) As to a child who is less than sixteen years of age, 106 any of the following acts which a parent, guardian or 107 custodian shall engage in, attempt to engage in, or know-

- 108 ingly procure another person to engage in, with such child,
- 109 notwithstanding the fact that the child may have willingly
- 110 participated in such conduct or the fact that the child may
- 111 have suffered no apparent physical injury or mental or
- 112 emotional injury as a result of such conduct:
- 113 (i) Sexual intercourse;
- 114 (ii) Sexual intrusion;
- 115 (iii) Sexual contact;
- (B) As to a child who is sixteen years of age or older, any
- 117 of the following acts which a parent, guardian or custo-
- 118 dian shall engage in, attempt to engage in, or knowingly
- 119 procure another person to engage in, with such child,
- 120 notwithstanding the fact that the child may have con-
- 121 sented to such conduct or the fact that the child may have
- 122 suffered no apparent physical injury or mental or emo-
- 123 tional injury as a result of such conduct:
- 124 (i) Sexual intercourse;
- 125 (ii) Sexual intrusion; or
- 126 (iii) Sexual contact;
- 127 (C) Any conduct whereby a parent, guardian or custo-
- 128 dian displays his or her sex organs to a child, or procures
- 129 another person to display his or her sex organs to a child,
- 130 for the purpose of gratifying the sexual desire of the
- 131 parent, guardian or custodian, of the person making such
- display, or of the child, or for the purpose of affronting or
- 133 alarming the child.
- 134 (k) "Sexual contact" means sexual contact as that term
- 135 is defined in section one, article eight-b, chapter sixty-one
- 136 of this code.
- 137 (l) "Sexual exploitation" means an act whereby:
- 138 (1) A parent, custodian or guardian, whether for finan-
- 139 cial gain or not, persuades, induces, entices or coerces a
- 140 child to engage in sexually explicit conduct as that term is
- 141 defined in section one, article eight-c, chapter sixty-one of
- 142 this code;

- 143 (2) A parent, guardian or custodian persuades, induces,
- 144 entices or coerces a child to display his or her sex organs
- 145 for the sexual gratification of the parent, guardian,
- 146 custodian or a third person, or to display his or her sex
- 147 organs under circumstances in which the parent, guardian
- or custodian knows such display is likely to be observed by
- 149 others who would be affronted or alarmed.
- 150 (m) "Sexual intercourse" means sexual intercourse as
- that term is defined in section one, article eight-b, chapter
- 152 sixty-one of this code.
- 153 (n) "Sexual intrusion" means sexual intrusion as that
- 154 term is defined in section one, article eight-b, chapter
- 155 sixty-one of this code.
- 156 (o) "Parental rights" means any and all rights and duties
- 157 regarding a parent to a minor child, including, but not
- 158 limited to, custodial rights and visitational rights and
- 159 rights to participate in the decisions affecting a minor
- 160 child.
- 161 (p) "Placement" means any temporary or permanent
- 162 placement of a child who is in the custody of the state in
- any foster home, group home or other facility or residence.
- 164 (g) "Serious physical abuse" means bodily injury which
- 165 creates a substantial risk of death, which causes serious or
- 166 prolonged disfigurement, prolonged impairment of health
- 167 or prolonged loss or impairment of the function of any
- 168 bodily organ.
- 169 (r) "Siblings" means children who have at least one
- 170 biological parent in common or who have been legally
- 171 adopted by the same parents or parent.
- 172 (s) "Time-limited reunification services" means individ-
- 173 ual, group, and family counseling, inpatient, residential or
- 174 outpatient substance abuse treatment services, mental
- 175 health services, assistance to address domestic violence.
- 176 services designed to provide temporary child care and
- 177 therapeutic services for families, including crisis nurseries
- 178 and transportation to or from any such services, provided
- 179 during fifteen of the most recent twenty-two months a
