## Senate Bill No. 201

(SENATOR LOVE, *original sponsor*)

[Passed February 9, 2000; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend article one, chapter twenty-five of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated section eleven-e, relating to prohibiting the unauthorized use of a uniform, badge, identification card or other insignia of the division of corrections and the impersonation of its employees; and establishing a criminal penalty.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That article one, chapter twenty-five of the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated section eleven-e, to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 1. ORGANIZATION AND INSTITUTIONS.**


**§25-1-11e. Unauthorized use of uniform, badge, identification card or other insignia; impersonation of member; and penalty.**

1 (a) No person who is not an officer or employee of the  
2 division of corrections, and no officer or employee of the  
3 division who is not authorized to do so, may, with intent to  
4 deceive, wear, use, order to be used or worn, copy or  
5 imitate in any respect or manner the uniform, badge,  
6 identification card or other insignia prescribed for em-  
7 ployees of the division.

8 (b) No person who is not an officer or employee of the  
9 division of corrections may falsely represent himself or  
10 herself to be an officer or employee of the division of  
11 corrections or to be under the order or direction of any  
12 officer or employee of the division.

13 (c) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection  
14 (a) or (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and,  
15 upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than two  
16 hundred dollars, or confined in the county or regional jail  
17 for not more than six months, or both fined and confined.
