
AN ACT to amend the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, by adding thereto a new chapter, designated chapter twenty-four-e, relating to forming a statewide addressing and mapping board; establishing a temporary board; and providing the rural areas of the state with city-type addressing.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the code of West Virginia, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new chapter, designated chapter twenty-four-e, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 24E. STATEWIDE ADDRESSING AND MAPPING.

- ARTICLE 1. WEST VIRGINIA STATEWIDE ADDRESSING AND MAPPING BOARD.
- §24E-1-1. Legislative findings; purpose.
 - 1 (a) The Legislature finds and declares:





- 2 (1) That large areas of the state remain without city-type 3 addressing, despite the best efforts of local officials;
- 4 (2) That city-type addressing is essential to the prompt 5 and accurate dispatch of emergency service providers;
- 6 (3) That citizens of rural areas of the state that are not 7 city-type addressed should enjoy the same security, safety 8 and peace of mind as citizens in those areas that have been 9 city-type addressed;
- 10 (4) That a statewide system for city-type addressing 11 would provide citizens of rural areas throughout the state 12 with security, safety and peace of mind;
- 13 (5) That, despite progress in certain areas, a statewide 14 addressing system cannot be achieved without action by 15 the Legislature;
- 16 (6) That certain counties and municipalities in the state 17 have, nonetheless, made progress in achieving city-type 18 addressing in their respective jurisdictions and their 19 accomplishments ought to be respected;
- 20 (7) That a statewide mapping system, utilizing digital 21 mapping systems, geographic information systems, global 22 positioning systems or other appropriate systems, would 23 further aid the dispatch of emergency service providers, 24 thereby further increasing the security, safety and peace of 25 mind of the citizens of the state;
- 26 (8) That a temporary board, consisting of qualified 27 persons representing the disciplines most affected by an 28 integrated statewide addressing and mapping system, is 29 the best means to achieve a system; and
- 30 (9) That certain entities have shown interest in providing 31 for a source of funding for accomplishing a system and 32 should be encouraged to do so.
- (b) It is, therefor, the purpose of this article to achieve a
 statewide addressing and mapping system that will be as

- 35 uniform as possible while respecting the past accomplish-
- 36 ments of local officials, that will be achieved quickly and
- 37 cost effectively, that will be accomplished at a minimal
- 38 cost, if any, to the taxpayer and that will use sound and
- 39 recognized methods and standards.

§24E-1-2. Definitions.

- 1 (a) "Board" means the West Virginia statewide address-
- 2 ing and mapping board.
- 3 (b) "Emergency service provider" means any emergency
- 4 services organization or public safety unit.
- 5 (c) "Fund" means the West Virginia statewide address-
- 6 ing and mapping fund.
- 7 (d) "Local exchange telephone company" means any
- 8 public utility that is engaged in the provision of local
- 9 exchange telephone service in this state and that operates
- 10 and maintains an automatic location identification
- 11 database of addresses of subscribers for use with enhanced
- 12 emergency telephone systems.
- 13 (e) "Public agency" means any municipality, county,
- 14 public district or public authority that provides or has the
- 15 authority to provide firefighting, police, ambulance,
- 16 medical rescue or other emergency services.

§24-1-3. West Virginia statewide addressing and mapping board created; appointment of board members; submission of recommendations by certain organizations; term of office; compensation and expenses of board members.

- 1 (a) There is hereby created the West Virginia statewide
- 2 addressing and mapping board. The board is to be com-
- 3 posed of eleven members appointed by the governor, one
- 4 of whom is to be a public service commissioner or a
- 5 member of the staff of the public service commission, one
- 6 of whom is to be an official or employee of the state
- 7 geological and economic survey, established and continued

under section four, article two, chapter twenty-nine of this 9 code, qualified in the field of geographic information 10 systems, one of whom is to be an official or employee of 11 the department of military affairs and public safety, one of 12 whom is to be an official or employee of the division of highways, one of whom is to be a county commissioner. 13 14 one of whom is to be a county assessor, one of whom is to be a mayor of a municipality or a municipal official, one 15 of whom is to be a director of an enhanced emergency 16 telephone system from a county with a population of thirty 17 18 thousand or less as shown by the last federal census, one of whom is to be a director of an enhanced emergency 19 20 telephone system from a county with a population of greater than thirty thousand as shown by the last federal 21 22 census, one of whom is to be a representative of a local 23 exchange telephone company, and one of whom is to be a 24 member of the public at-large but may be affiliated with 25 any of the above entities. In making appointments to the board, the governor shall, to the extent possible, ensure 26 27 representation on the board, by one or more members, of 28 any entity providing twenty-five percent or more of 29 funding to the statewide addressing and mapping fund 30 created by section five of this article.

- 31 (b) The governor shall designate a member to preside at 32 the first meeting of the board until a chairman is elected. 33 At the first meeting of the board, it shall elect a chairman 34 from its members. The member so elected is to hold the 35 office of chairman at the will and pleasure of the majority 36 of the total membership of the board.
- 37 (c) The public service commission, the director of the state geological and economic survey, the secretary of the 38 39 department of military affairs and public safety, the commissioner of the division of highways, the association 40 of counties, the West Virginia county commissioners' 41 42 association and the West Virginia municipal league, the 43 West Virginia enhanced 911 council and each local ex-44 change telephone company shall submit two names of

- 45 recommended persons to the governor for each appoint-
- 46 ment representing its respective discipline. The governor
- 47 is not limited in his or her appointments, however, to the
- 48 names so recommended.
- 49 (d) The term of office for members of the board is six
- 50 years.
- 51 (e) Members of the board are entitled to the same
- 52 expense reimbursement paid to members of the Legisla-
- 53 ture for their interim duties as recommended by the
- 54 citizens legislative compensation commission and autho-
- 55 rized by law for each day or substantial portion thereof
- 56 engaged in the performance of official duties. Their
- 57 expense reimbursement is to be paid from the West
- 58 Virginia statewide addressing and mapping fund created
- 59 by section five of this article.

§24E-1-4. Powers and duties of the West Virginia statewide addressing and mapping board.

- 1 The board may exercise all powers necessary or appro-
- 2 priate to effectuate the purposes of this article, including,
- 3 without limitation, the powers:
- 4 (1) To adopt statewide addressing and mapping stan-
- 5 dards and requirements in accordance with sections six
- 6 and seven of this article;
- 7 (2) To enter into any agreements or other transactions in
- 8 order to accomplish the addressing and mapping, in order
- 9 to secure funding for the statewide addressing and map-
- 10 ping fund created by section five of this article or other-
- 11 wise in order to accomplish the purposes of the article;
- 12 (3) To manage and use the West Virginia statewide
- 13 addressing and mapping fund created by section five of
- 14 this article in order to pay for the costs of statewide
- 15 addressing and mapping;
- 16 (4) To accept any private, federal or other funding that
- 17 may be available to effectuate the purposes of this article

- 18 and to deposit any funding in the West Virginia statewide
- 19 addressing and mapping fund created by section five of
- 20 this article; and
- 21 (5) To do all other acts necessary and proper to carry out
- 22 its powers and the purposes of this article.

§24E-1-5. West Virginia statewide addressing and mapping fund.

- 1 (a) There is hereby created a special fund that is desig-
- 2 nated as the "West Virginia Statewide Addressing and
- 3 Mapping Fund". The fund shall be treated by the auditor
- 4 and treasurer as a special revenue fund and not as part of
- 5 the general revenue of the state: *Provided*. That nothing
- 6 in this article can be construed to require any appropria-
- 7 tion by the Legislature to the fund.
- 8 (b) The board shall hold the proceeds of the fund in trust
- 9 and shall manage the proceeds of the fund solely to
- 10 accomplish the purposes of this article.
- 11 (c) Disbursements from the fund may be made only upon
- 12 the written requisition of the chairman accompanied by a
- 13 certified resolution of the board and may be made solely to
- 14 accomplish the purposes of this article.
- 15 (d) Any amount remaining in the fund upon the termina-
- 16 tion of the board is to be transferred to county commis-
- 17 sions of the state and may be used by them solely for the
- 18 purposes of maintaining and updating the statewide
- 19 addressing and mapping to be accomplished by this
- 20 article. No later than the first day of January, two thou-
- 21 sand five, the board shall propose rules for governing the
- 22 distribution of any amount among the various county
- 23 commissions for legislative approval in accordance with
- 24 the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of
- 25 this code. The rules may not be filed as emergency rules.

§24E-1-6. Legislative and emergency rules governing addressing and mapping standards.

- 1 (a) The board is hereby authorized to propose rules
- 2 governing statewide addressing and mapping standards
- 3 for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions
- 4 of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code.
- 5 Emergency rules are specifically authorized for this
- 6 purpose.
- 7 (b) Any rules proposed by the board must exempt from
- 8 the statewide addressing and mapping standards any
- 9 county or municipality that has completed city-type
- 10 addressing under the authority granted in section three,
- 11 article one, chapter seven of this code or otherwise.
- 12 (c) In proposing any rules, the board shall consider all
- 13 relevant factors, including, but not limited to, the follow-
- 14 ing:
- 15 (1) The system and costs of administering a city-type
- 16 addressing system;
- 17 (2) The system and costs of separately naming or renam-
- 18 ing roads and streets;
- 19 (3) The desirability of standard road and street suffixes:
- 20 (4) The desirability of standards for driveways and
- 21 private roads;
- 22 (5) The desirability of standard address numbering
- 23 increments:
- 24 (6) The system and costs of assigning address numbers;
- 25 (7) The system and costs for road naming and numbering
- 26 for neighboring localities;
- 27 (8) The desirability of standards using digital mapping,
- 28 geographic information systems and global positioning
- 29 systems;
- 30 (9) The desirability of standards applicable to road
- 31 signs;

- 32 (10) The desirability for requirements for displaying
- 33 address numbers: and
- 34 (11) The desirability of the adoption of national emer-
- 35 gency number association standards.

824E-1-7. Request for proposals: title to works: disbursements to vendors and public agencies; legislative and emergency rules.

- 1 (a) The board shall, no later than the first day of Janu-
- 2 ary, two thousand two, issue a request or requests for
- 3 proposals for statewide addressing and mapping. The
- 4 request for proposal must include requirements that each
- 5 map, compilation or other work created as a result of the
- 6 statewide addressing and mapping intended to be accom-
- plished by this article must be a "work made for hire" 7
- 8 within the meaning of the copyright laws of the United
- 9 States, 17 U. S. C. §101, et seq., and that all right, title and
- 10 interest to each map, compilation or other work must vest
- 11 in the board. The request or requests for proposal may
- include any standards or requirements the board finds 12
- 13 necessary or proper, including, without limitation, compli-
- ance with any applicable emergency or legislative rules. 14
- The board shall select a qualified vendor or vendors in 15
- accordance with the applicable provisions of article three, 16
- 17 chapter five-a of this code. Disbursements from the West
- Virginia statewide addressing and mapping fund estab-18
- 19 lished by section five of this article are specifically autho-
- 20 rized in order to pay the selected vendor or vendors.
- 21 (b) The board may also consider applications of public
- agencies, including, without limitation, county commis-22
- 23 sions and municipalities, to participate in the statewide
- 24 addressing and mapping to be accomplished by this
- article. Disbursements from the West Virginia statewide 25
- addressing and mapping fund are specifically authorized 26
- in order to reimburse such public agencies, in whole or in 27
- 28 part, for the costs incurred by them in participating in the

- 29 addressing and mapping to be accomplished by this 30 article, in the amount, if any, determined by the board.
- 31 (c) No later than the first day of January, two thousand 32 two, the board shall propose legislative rules to accom-33 plish the purposes of this section in accordance with the 34 provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code. The rules may require public agencies that apply for 35 36 reimbursement under this section, but that are exempt from statewide standards under section six of this article. 37 38 to comply with acceptable standards to be specified in 39 those rules as a condition of receiving reimbursement. The standards, however, are not necessarily required to be the 40 statewide standards to be proposed by the board in 41 42 legislative rules under section six of this article. Emer-

§24E-1-8. Liability limitation.

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1 No person is liable for damages for injury, death or loss

gency rules are specifically authorized for the purposes of

- 2 to persons or property arising from any act or omission,
- 3 except willful or wanton misconduct, in connection with
- 4 developing or implementing the statewide addressing and
- 5 mapping to be accomplished by this article or in connec-
- 6 tion with providing information or assistance related to
- 7 the addressing and mapping or as a result of providing
- 8 funding to the statewide addressing and mapping fund
- 9 created by section five of this article.

$\S24E$ -1-9. Standard fees for maps, compilations or other works.

- 1 (a) The board is hereby authorized to propose rules for
- legislative approval, in accordance with the provisions of
- 3 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, to
- 4 establish standard fees for copies or use of any maps,
- 5 compilations or other works that may be created as a
- $\,\,$ $\,$ result of the statewide addressing and mapping intended
- 7 to be accomplished by this article. Those rules must

- 8 exempt from the payment of fees, however, any entity providing twenty-five percent or more of the funding to 10 the statewide addressing and mapping fund created by section five of this article. Those rules also must exempt 11 12 from the payment of the fees county commissions obtain-13 ing the maps, compilations or other works for use in its 14 enhanced emergency telephone system established under 15 article six, chapter twenty-four of this code. The board 16 may propose other exemptions in such rules. The other-17 wise payable standard fees must be reasonable and must, 18 to the extent possible, be based on cost. Until the termination of the board in accordance with section eleven of this 19 20 article, any fees are to be payable to the board and the 21 board shall deposit those fees in the West Virginia state-22 wide addressing and mapping fund created by section five 23 of this article. Emergency rules are specifically authorized 24 for the purposes of this section.
- 25 (b) Prior to the distribution or use of any maps, compila-26 tions or other works created as a result of the statewide 27 addressing and mapping intended to be accomplished by 28 this article, the board shall propose rules for legislative 29 approval, in accordance with the provisions of article 30 three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, establishing the 31 conditions and requirements governing the distribution of 32 those works, including provisions ensuring the effective 33 distribution of those works to persons with a legitimate 34 need to know, but respecting, where possible, any reason-35 able expectations of privacy of the information contained 36 in those works, such as the names, addresses and locations 37 of the citizens of the state. The rules proposed for this 38 purpose must be consistent with the West Virginia Free-39 dom of Information Act, article one, chapter twenty-nine-40 b of this code. Emergency rules are specifically authorized 41 for this purpose.

§24E-1-10. Use of facilities of public service commission.

- 1 The board may, with the permission of, and under the
- 2 supervision of, the public service commission, use the

- 3 facilities, staff or other resources of the public service
- 4 commission in connection with accomplishing the pur-
- 5 poses of this article.
- §24-1-11. Termination of board; transfer of duties and title to works to counties and public service commission; legislative and emergency rules for standards; legislative and emergency rules for standard fees to be charged by counties for digital or other maps, compilations or other works.
 - 1 (a) The board shall terminate the first day of April, two
 - 2 thousand seven, pursuant to the provisions of article ten,
 - 3 chapter four of this code, unless sooner terminated,
 - 4 continued or reestablished pursuant to the provisions of
 - 5 that article. The board shall, as its last official act prior to
 - 6 its termination, transfer all right, title and interest to any
 - 7 maps, compilations or other works that may be created as
 - 8 a result of the statewide addressing and mapping intended
 - 9 to be accomplished by this article to the respective county
 - 10 commissions.
 - 11 (b) Upon the termination of the board, county commis-
 - 12 sions shall maintain and update the addressing and
 - 13 mapping systems within their respective jurisdictions
 - 14 under the standards established by the board, as updated
 - 15 thereafter by the public service commission under this
 - 16 section.
 - 17 (c) Upon termination of the board, the public service
 - 18 commission shall, from time to time as it finds reasonable
 - 19 and in the public interest, maintain and update the
 - 20 standards for statewide addressing and mapping in
 - 21 accordance with the procedures for rulemaking under
 - 22 section seven, article one, chapter twenty-four of this code.
 - 23 (d) The public service commission is hereby authorized
 - 24 to prescribe rules, in accordance with the procedures for
 - 25 rulemaking under section seven, article one, chapter
 - 26 twenty-four of this code and effective upon termination of

- the board, for standard fees to be charged by county
- 28 commissions for copies or use of any maps, compilations
- or other works created as a result of the statewide address-29
- 30 ing and mapping to be accomplished by this article and to
- 31 be maintained and updated by the county commissions
- after the termination of the board. The rules must include 32
- 33 the exemptions provided under section nine of this article.
- The fees established by the rules must be reasonable and 34
- 35 must, to the extent possible, be based on cost. The public
- 36 service commission shall, from time to time as it finds
- reasonable and in the public interest, revise and update 37
- 38
- these rules, including, without limitation, the standard
- fees to be charged. 39

§24E-1-12. Liberal construction.

- 1 This article is remedial and is to be construed liberally
- in order to effectuate its purposes.
