[Passed March 11, 2006; to take effect July 1, 2006.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact §15-2-4 and §15-2-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to the appointment, temporary promotion and compensation of the membership of the West Virginia State Police; providing for the temporary promotion from the membership of the executive protection section of the West Virginia State Police; providing annual salary schedules and adjusting annual experience increment pay for the West Virginia State Police; and authorizing recovery of compensation from certain members.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §15-2-4 and §15-2-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.

§15-2-4. Appointment of commissioned officers, noncommissioned officers, other members; temporary and permanent positions.

- (a) The superintendent shall appoint, from the enlisted 1 membership of the State Police, a deputy superintendent who shall hold the rank of lieutenant colonel and be next 4 in authority to the superintendent. The superintendent 5 shall appoint, from the enlisted membership of the State 6 Police, the number of other officers and members he or she 7 considers necessary to operate and maintain the executive 8 offices, training school and forensic laboratory; and to 9 keep records relating to crimes and criminals, coordinate 10 traffic safety activities, maintain a system of supplies and 11 accounting and perform other necessary services.
- (b) The ranks within the membership of the State Police 12 13 shall be colonel, lieutenant colonel, major, captain, first 14 lieutenant, second lieutenant, first sergeant, sergeant, 15 corporal, trooper first class, senior trooper, trooper or 16 cadet trooper. Each member while in uniform shall wear 17 the insignia of rank as provided by law and written State 18 Police policies. Members assigned to the forensic laboratory shall hold the title of trooper, be classified as 19 20 criminalists and wear the insignia of classification as 21 provided by written State Police policies.

22 The superintendent may appoint from the membership 23 of the State Police seventeen principal supervisors who 24 shall receive the compensation and hold the temporary 25 rank of lieutenant colonel, major or captain at the will and pleasure of the superintendent. The superintendent may 26 27 also appoint from the membership of the executive 28 protection section of the State Police two additional 29 supervisors who shall receive the compensation and hold 30 the temporary rank of first lieutenant and serve at the will 31 and pleasure of the superintendent. Appointments are 32 exempt from any eligibility requirements established by 33 the career progression system: *Provided*, That any member 34 appointed from within the executive protection section of the State Police to the temporary rank of first lieutenant 35 must have completed a minimum of two years service 36 within the executive protection section prior to becoming 37

- 38 eligible for such appointment. Any person appointed to a
- 39 temporary rank under the provisions of this article re-
- 40 mains eligible for promotion or reclassification under the
- 41 provisions of the career progression system if his or her
- 42 permanent rank is below that of first lieutenant. Upon the
- 43 termination of a temporary appointment by the superin-
- 44 tendent, the member may not be reduced to a rank or
- 45 classification below his or her permanent rank or classifi-
- 46 cation, unless the reduction results from disciplinary
- 47 action, and remains eligible for subsequent appointment
- 48 to a temporary rank.

§15-2-5. Career progression system; salaries; exclusion from wage and hour law, with supplemental payment; bond; leave time for members called to duty in guard or reserves.

- 1 (a) The superintendent shall establish within the West
- 2 Virginia State Police a system to provide for: The promo-
- 3 tion of members to the supervisory ranks of sergeant, first
- 4 sergeant, second lieutenant and first lieutenant; the
- 5 classification of nonsupervisory members within the field
- 6 operations force to the ranks of trooper, senior trooper,
- 7 trooper first class or corporal; the classification of mem-
- 8 bers assigned to the forensic laboratory as criminalist I-
- 9 VII; and the temporary reclassification of members
- 10 assigned to administrative duties as administrative
- 11 support specialist I-VIII.
- 12 (b) The superintendent may propose legislative rules for
- 13 promulgation in accordance with article three, chapter
- 14 twenty-nine-a of this code for the purpose of ensuring
- 15 consistency, predictability and independent review of any
- 16 system developed under the provisions of this section.
- 17 (c) The superintendent shall provide to each member a
- 18 written manual governing any system established under
- 19 the provisions of this section and specific procedures shall
- 20 be identified for the evaluation and testing of members for
- 21 promotion or reclassification and the subsequent place-

set forth in subsection (d) of this section, for grade in rank,

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- based on length of service, including that service served 196 197 before and after the effective date of this section with the West Virginia State Police as follows: At the end of two 198 years of service with the West Virginia State Police, the 199 200 member shall receive a salary increase of four hundred 201 dollars to be effective during his or her next year of service 202 and a like increase at yearly intervals thereafter, with the 203 increases to be cumulative.
- (f) In applying the salary schedules set forth in this section where salary increases are provided for length of service, members of the West Virginia State Police in service at the time the schedules become effective shall be given credit for prior service and shall be paid the salaries the same length of service entitles them to receive under the provisions of this section.
- 211 (g) The Legislature finds and declares that because of the 212 unique duties of members of the West Virginia State 213 Police, it is not appropriate to apply the provisions of state 214 wage and hour laws to them. Accordingly, members of the 215 West Virginia State Police are excluded from the provi-216 sions of state wage and hour law. This express exclusion 217 shall not be construed as any indication that the members 218 were or were not covered by the wage and hour law prior 219 to this exclusion.
- In lieu of any overtime pay they might otherwise have received under the wage and hour law, and in addition to their salaries and increases for length of service, members who have completed basic training and who are exempt from federal Fair Labor Standards Act guidelines may receive supplemental pay as provided in this section.
- The authority of the superintendent to propose a legislative rule or amendment thereto for promulgation in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to establish the number of hours per month which constitute the standard work month for the members of the West Virginia State Police is hereby continued.

- The rule shall further establish, on a graduated hourly 232 233 basis, the criteria for receipt of a portion or all of supple-234 mental payment when hours are worked in excess of the 235 standard work month. The superintendent shall certify 236 monthly to the West Virginia State Police's payroll officer 237 the names of those members who have worked in excess of 238 the standard work month and the amount of their entitle-239 ment to supplemental payment. The supplemental pay-240 ment may not exceed two hundred thirty-six dollars 241 monthly. The superintendent and civilian employees of 242 the West Virginia State Police are not eligible for any 243 supplemental payments.
- 244 (h) Each member of the West Virginia State Police, 245 except the superintendent and civilian employees, shall execute, before entering upon the discharge of his or her 246 247 duties, a bond with security in the sum of five thousand 248 dollars payable to the State of West Virginia, conditioned 249 upon the faithful performance of his or her duties, and the 250 bond shall be approved as to form by the Attorney General and as to sufficiency by the Governor. 251
- 252 (i) In consideration for compensation paid by the West 253 Virginia State Police to its members during those mem-254 bers' participation in the West Virginia State Police Cadet 255 Training Program pursuant to section eight, article 256 twenty-nine, chapter thirty of this code, the West Virginia 257 State Police may require of its members by written 258 agreement entered into with each of them in advance of 259 such participation in the program that, if a member should 260 voluntarily discontinue employment any time within one 261 year immediately following completion of the training 262 program, he or she shall be obligated to pay to the West 263 Virginia State Police a pro rata portion of such compensa-264 tion equal to that part of such year which the member has 265 chosen not to remain in the employ of the West Virginia 266 State Police.
- (j) Any member of the West Virginia State Police who iscalled to perform active duty training or inactive duty

269	training in the National Guard or any reserve component
270	of the Armed Forces of the United States annually shall be
271	granted, upon request, leave time not to exceed thirty
272	calendar days for the purpose of performing the active
273	duty training or inactive duty training and the time
274	granted may not be deducted from any leave accumulated
275	as a member of the West Virginia State Police.
