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

(By Senators Plymale, Edgell, Dempsey, Oliverio, Boley, Guills and Sprouse)

[Passed March 11, 2006, in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to amend and reenact §18A-4-2a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new section, designated §18A-4-2b, all relating to defining completion of the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards certification; establishing state minimum salary supplement for professional personnel holding certain advanced certification in speech-language pathology, audiology or counseling; reimbursement for certain expenses; limitations; applicability; and state board rule.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18A-4-2a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §18A-4-2b, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 4. SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER BENEFITS.

§18A-4-2a. State minimum salary bonus for classroom teachers with national board certification.

- 1 (a) The Legislature hereby finds and declares that the
- 2 rigorous standards and processes for certification by the
- 3 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards
- 4 (NBPTS) helps to promote the quality of teaching and
- 5 learning. Therefore, classroom teachers in the public
- 6 schools of West Virginia should be encouraged to achieve
- 7 national board certification through a reimbursement of
- 8 expenses and an additional salary bonus which reflects
- 9 their additional certification, to be paid in accordance
- 10 with the provisions of this section.
- 11 (b) Two thousand five hundred dollars shall be paid
- 12 annually to each classroom teacher who holds a valid
- 13 certificate issued by the National Board of Professional
- 14 Teaching Standards for the life of the certification, but in
- 15 no event more than ten years for any one certification.
- 16 (c) The payments:
- 17 (1) Shall be in addition to any amounts prescribed in the
- 18 applicable state minimum salary schedule;
- 19 (2) Shall be paid in equal monthly installments; and
- 20 (3) Shall be considered a part of the state minimum
- 21 salaries for teachers.
- 22 (d) One-half the certification fee shall be paid for
- 23 reimbursement once to each teacher who enrolls in the
- 24 program for the National Board for Professional Teaching
- 25 Standards certification and one-half the certification fee
- 26 shall be paid for reimbursement once to each teacher who
- 27 completes the National Board for Professional Teaching
- 28 Standards certification. Completion shall be defined as
- 29 the completion of ten scorable entries, as verified by the
- 30 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.
- 31 Teachers who achieve National Board for Professional
- 32 Teaching Standards certification may be reimbursed a

- 33 maximum of six hundred dollars for expenses actually
- 34 incurred while obtaining the National Board for Profes-
- 35 sional Teaching Standards certification.
- 36 (e) The state board shall limit the number of teachers
- 37 who receive the initial reimbursements of the certification
- 38 fees set forth in subsection (d) to two hundred teachers
- 39 annually. The state board shall establish selection criteria
- 40 for the teachers by the legislative rule required pursuant
- 41 to subsection (g) of this section.
- 42 (f) Subject to the provisions of subsection (e) of this
- 43 section, funding for reimbursement of the certification fee
- 44 and expenses actually incurred while obtaining the
- 45 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards
- 46 certifications shall be administered by the state depart-
- 47 ment of education from an appropriation established for
- 48 that purpose by the Legislature. If funds appropriated by
- 49 the Legislature to accomplish the purposes of this subsec-
- 50 tion are insufficient, the state department shall prorate the
- 51 reimbursements for expenses and shall request of the
- 52 Legislature, at its next regular session, funds sufficient to
- 53 accomplish the purposes of this subsection, including
- 54 needed retroactive payments.
- 55 (g) The state board shall promulgate legislative rules
- 56 pursuant to article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of this
- 57 code to implement the provisions of this section.

§18A-4-2b. State minimum salary supplement for professional personnel with recognized national certification in speech-language pathology, audiology or counseling.

- 1 (a) (1) The Legislature finds that achieving a nationally
- 2 recognized professional certification in speech-language
- 3 pathology or audiology involves a rigorous process of
- 4 demonstrating both knowledge and skills and results in
- 5 highly trained and capable employees. Individuals who
- 6 attain the national professional certification by the

- 7 American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA)
- 8 provide needed and essential services to the school stu-
- 9 dents of this state and, consequently, should be encour-
- 10 aged to achieve and maintain the national board certifica-
- 11 tion through reimbursement of expenses and a salary
- 12 bonus which reflects their additional certification, to be
- 13 paid in accordance with subsection (b) of this section.
- 14 (2) The Legislature further finds and declares that the
- 15 rigorous standards and processes for advanced certifica-
- 16 tion by either the National Board of Certified Counselors
- 17 (NBCC) or the West Virginia Board of Examiners in
- 18 Counseling (WVBEC) helps to promote the quality of
- 19 counseling in schools. Counselors in the public schools of
- 20 West Virginia should be encouraged to achieve and
- 21 maintain the advanced certification through reimburse-
- 22 ment of expenses and a salary bonus that reflects their
- 23 additional certification, to be paid in accordance with
- 24 subsection (b) of this section.
- 25 (3) Therefore, the purpose of this section is to provide a
- 26 statewide salary supplement for certain professional
- 27 personnel employed in the public schools who hold a
- 28 nationally recognized professional certification in
- 29 speech-language pathology, audiology or counseling, to
- 30 treat the professional certification equally, to encourage
- 31 others to attain such a certification and to help school
- 32 systems with recruitment of these highly qualified profes-
- 33 sionals.
- 34 (b) In addition to any amounts prescribed in the applica-
- 35 ble state minimum salary schedule, effective the first day
- of July, two thousand six, any professional personnel who
- 37 hold national certification or other credential as provided
- 38 in this section must be paid an annual salary supplement
- 39 of two thousand five hundred dollars. The payment is:
- 40 (1) To be made in equal monthly installments;
- 41 (2) To be considered a part of the state minimum salaries
- 42 for teachers: and

- 43 (3) To continue for the life of the certification, or for ten 44 years for any one certification, whichever first expires.
- 45 (c) Effective the first day of July, two thousand six, professional personnel employed as speech-language 46 47 pathologists, audiologists or counselors are eligible upon 48 enrollment for reimbursement for one-half of the fee for 49 certification in accordance with this section. In addition, these personnel are eligible upon attainment of the certifi-50 51 cation for reimbursement of the remainder of the applica-52 tion fee plus other expenses actually incurred toward 53 attainment of the certification, not exceeding six hundred 54 dollars, upon approval by the Department of Education. 55 No more than one hundred speech-language pathologists, 56 audiologists and counselors, combined total, are eligible 57 for reimbursement in any one fiscal year.
- 58 (d) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, no 59 more than one hundred speech-language pathologists, audiologists and counselors, combined total, shall be paid 60 the annual salary supplement provided for in said subsec-61 tion during the first year of implementation. The number 62 63 of speech-language pathologists, audiologists and counsel-64 ors paid the annual salary supplement provided for in said 65 subsection may not exceed an additional one hundred qualified recipients in each of the subsequent fiscal years. 66 67 The state board shall promulgate a legislative rule establishing criteria for selection of the individuals eligible for 68 reimbursement and a salary supplement in accordance 69 with this section. The selection criteria shall prioritize the 70 71 length of time the certification has been held and the years 72 of experience of the holder in determining eligibility.
- 73 (e) The board shall report the rule to the Legislative 74 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability by the 75 January, two thousand seven, legislative interim meeting 76 period and shall report on its progress in developing the 77 rule to the commission during each prior interim meeting 78 period.

- 79 (f) Payment of the supplement and reimbursement
- 80 provided in this section is subject to legislative appropria-
- 81 tion; therefore nothing in this section requires any appro-
- 82 priation, or any specific level of appropriation, by the
- 83 Legislature.
- 84 (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section
- 85 or the provisions of section two-a of this article, profes-
- 86 sional personnel may not be paid a salary supplement
- 87 pursuant to the provisions of both said sections.
