# Senate Bill No. 150

(By Senators Tomblin, Mr. President, and Caruth, By Request of the Executive)

[Passed March 16, 2008; in effect from passage.]

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OF SECRETIVING STATE (C)

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## Senate Bill No. 150

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AN ACT making appropriations of public money out of the Treasury in accordance with section fifty-one, article VI of the Constitution.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

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TITLE I-GENERAL PROVISIONS.

1 Section 1. General policy.—The purpose of this bill is 2 to appropriate money necessary for the economical and 3 efficient discharge of the duties and responsibilities of 4 the state and its agencies during the fiscal year two 5 thousand nine.

6 Sec. 2. Definitions.—For the purpose of this bill:

7 "Governor" shall mean the Governor of the State of8 West Virginia.

9 "Code" shall mean the Code of West Virginia, one10 thousand nine hundred thirty-one, as amended.

"Spending unit" shall mean the department, bureau,
division, office, board, commission, agency or institution
to which an appropriation is made.

The "fiscal year two thousand nine" shall mean the
period from the first day of July, two thousand eight,
through the thirtieth day of June, two thousand nine.

"General revenue fund" shall mean the general
operating fund of the state and includes all moneys
received or collected by the state except as provided in
section two, article two, chapter twelve of the code or as
otherwise provided.

22 "Special revenue funds" shall mean specific revenue
23 sources which by legislative enactments are not required
24 to be accounted for as general revenue, including federal
25 funds.

26 "From collections" shall mean that part of the total27 appropriation which must be collected by the spending

unit to be available for expenditure. If the authorized 28 amount of collections is not collected, the total 29 appropriation for the spending unit shall be reduced 30 automatically by the amount of the deficiency in the 31 collections: If the amount collected exceeds the amount 32 designated "from collections," the excess shall be set 33 aside in a special surplus fund and may be expended for 34 the purpose of the spending unit as provided by article 35 two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

## 1 Sec. 3. Classification of appropriations.—An 2 appropriation for:

"Personal services" shall mean salaries, wages and
other compensation paid to full-time, part-time and
temporary employees of the spending unit but shall not
include fees or contractual payments paid to consultants
or to independent contractors engaged by the spending
unit.

9 Unless otherwise specified, appropriations for 10 "personal services" shall include salaries of heads of 11 spending units.

"Annual increment" shall mean funds appropriated for
"eligible employees" and shall be disbursed only in
accordance with article five, chapter five of the code.

Funds appropriated for "annual increment" shall be
transferred to "personal services" or other designated
items only as required.

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18 "Employee benefits" shall mean social security
19 matching, workers' compensation, unemployment
20 compensation, pension and retirement contributions,

21public employees insurance matching, personnel fees or 22 any other benefit normally paid by the employer as a 23 direct cost of employment. Should the appropriation be insufficient to cover such costs, the remainder of such 24 25cost shall be transferred by each spending unit from its 26 "personal services" line item or its "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line item to its "employee 27 benefits" line item. If there is no appropriation for 28 29 "employee benefits," such costs shall be paid by each spending unit from its "personal services" line item, its 30 "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line item. 31 32 Each spending unit is hereby authorized and required to make such payments in accordance with the provisions 33 34 of article two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

"BRIM Premiums" shall mean the amount charged as
consideration for insurance protection and includes the
present value of projected losses and administrative
expenses. Premiums are assessed for coverages, as
defined in the applicable policies, for claims arising
from, interalia, general liability, wrongful acts, property,
professional liability and automobile exposures.

42 Should the appropriation for "BRIM Premiums" be 43 insufficient to cover such cost, the remainder of such **4**4 costs shall be transferred by each spending unit from its 45"personal services" line item, its "employee benefit" line item, its "unclassified" line item or any other 46 47 appropriate line item to "BRIM Premiums" for payment 48 to the Board of Risk and Insurance Management. Each 49 spending unit is hereby authorized and required to make 50 such payments.

51 Each spending unit shall be responsible for all 52 contributions, payments or other costs related to coverage and claims of its employees for unemployment
 compensation. Such expenditures shall be considered an

55 employee benefit.

56 "Current expenses" shall mean operating costs other
57 than personal services and shall not include equipment,
58 repairs and alterations, buildings or lands.

59 Each spending unit shall be responsible for and
60 charged monthly for all postage meter service and shall
61 reimburse the appropriate revolving fund monthly for all
62 such amounts. Such expenditures shall be considered a
63 current expense.

64 "Equipment" shall mean equipment items which have
65 an appreciable and calculable period of usefulness in
66 excess of one year.

67 "Repairs and alterations" shall mean routine
68 maintenance and repairs to structures and minor
69 improvements to property which do not increase the
70 capital assets.

"Buildings" shall include new construction and major
alteration of existing structures and the improvement of
lands and shall include shelter, support, storage,
protection or the improvement of a natural condition.

"Lands" shall mean the purchase of real property orinterest in real property.

"Capital outlay" shall mean and include buildings,
lands or buildings and lands, with such category or item
of appropriation to remain in effect as provided by
section twelve, article three, chapter twelve of the code.

From appropriations made to the spending units of 81 state government, upon approval of the governor there 82 may be transferred to a special account an amount 83 sufficient to match federal funds under any federal act. 84

Appropriations classified in any of the above categories 85 86 shall be expended only for the purposes as defined above and only for the spending units herein designated: 87 88 *Provided*, That the secretary of each department shall 89 have the authority to transfer within the department 90 those general revenue funds appropriated to the various 91 agencies of the department: Provided, however, That no more than five percent of the general revenue funds 92 93 appropriated to any one agency or board may be 94 transferred to other agencies or boards within the 95 department and no funds on transferred may be 96 transferred\_te\_a "personal\_services" line: Provided 97 further, That the secretary of each department and the director, commissioner, executive secretary, 98 99 superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not governed by a departmental secretary as established by 100 101 chapter five-f of the code shall have the authority to transfer funds appropriated to "personal services" and 102"employee benefits" to other lines within the same 103 account and no funds from other lines shall be 104 transferred to the "personal services" line: And provided 105 106 *further*, That the secretary of each department and the 107 director, commissioner, executive secretary, superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not 108 governed by a departmental secretary as established by 109 chapter five-f of the code shall have the authority to 110 transfer general revenue funds appropriated to "annual 111 increment" to other general revenue accounts within the 112 113 same department, bureau or commission for the purpose of providing an annual increment in accordance with 114



115 article five, chapter five of the code: And provided *further*, That no authority exists hereunder to transfer 116 funds into line-items to which no funds are legislatively 117 appropriated: And provided further, That if the 118 Legislature by subsequent enactment consolidates 119 agencies, boards or functions, the secretary or other 120appropriate agency head may transfer the funds formerly 121 122appropriated to such agency, board or function in order to implement such consolidation. No funds may be 123transferred from a Special Revenue Account, dedicated 124 125 account, capital expenditure account or any other account or fund specifically exempted by the Legislature 126 127 from transfer, except that the use of the appropriations from the State Road Fund for the office of the Secretary 128 129 of the Department of Transportation is not a use other than the purpose for which such funds were dedicated 130 131 and is permitted.

Appropriations otherwise classified shall be expended
only where the distribution of expenditures for different
purposes cannot well be determined in advance or it is
necessary or desirable to permit the spending unit the
freedom to spend an appropriation for more than one of
the above classifications.

1 Sec. 4. Method of expenditure.—Money appropriated 2 by this bill, unless otherwise specifically directed, shall 3 be appropriated and expended according to the 4 provisions of article three, chapter twelve of the code or 5 according to any law detailing a procedure specifically 6 limiting that article.

Sec. 5. Maximum expenditures.—No authority or
requirement of law shall be interpreted as requiring or
permitting an expenditure in excess of the
appropriations set out in this bill.

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reappropriated to June 30, 2009. Any balances so
reappropriated may be transferred and credited to the
fiscal year 2009 accounts.

Upon the written request of the Clerk of the Senate, the
auditor shall transfer amounts between items of the total
appropriation in order to protect or increase the
efficiency of the service.

23 The Clerk of the Senate, with the approval of the 24 president, is authorized to draw his or her requisitions upon the auditor, payable out of the Current Expenses 25and Contingent Fund of the senate, for any bills for 26 27 supplies and services that may have been incurred by the senate and not included in the appropriation bill, for 28 29 supplies and services incurred in preparation for the opening, the conduct of the business and after 30 31 adjournment of any regular or extraordinary session, and for the necessary operation of the senate offices, the 32 33 requisitions for which are to be accompanied by bills to 34 be filed with the auditor.

The Clerk of the Senate, with the written approval of 35 the president, or the President of the Senate shall have 36 37 authority to employ such staff personnel during any session of the Legislature as shall be needed in addition 38 to staff personnel authorized by the senate resolution 39 40 adopted during any such session. The Clerk of the Senate, with the written approval of the president, or the 41 42 President of the Senate shall have authority to employ such staff personnel between sessions of the Legislature 43 as shall be needed, the compensation of all staff 44 personnel during and between sessions of the 45 46 Legislature, notwithstanding any such senate resolution, 47 to be fixed by the President of the Senate. The clerk is

hereby authorized to draw his or her requisitions upon
the auditor for the payment of all such staff personnel for
such services, payable out of the appropriation for
Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees
or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate.

For duties imposed by law and by the senate, the Clerk
of the Senate shall be paid a monthly salary as provided
by the senate resolution, unless increased between
sessions under the authority of the president, payable out
of the appropriation for Compensation and Per Diem of
Officers and Employees or Current Expenses and
Contingent Fund of the senate.

60 The distribution of the blue book shall be by the office 61 of the Clerk of the Senate and shall include seventy-five 62 copies for each member of the Legislature and two copies 63 for each classified and approved high school and junior 64 high or middle school and one copy for each elementary 65 school within the state.

9 The appropriations for the house of delegates for the

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fiscal year 200\$ are to remain in full force and effect and
are hereby reappropriated to June 30, 2009. Any
balances so reappropriated may be transferred and
credited to the fiscal year 2009 accounts.

Upon the written request of the Clerk of the House of
Delegates, the auditor shall transfer amounts between
items of the total appropriation in order to protect or
increase the efficiency of the service.

18 The Clerk of the House of Delegates, with the approval 19 of the speaker, is authorized to draw his or her 20requisitions upon the auditor, payable out of the Current 21 Expenses and Contingent Fund of the house of delegates, 22for any bills for supplies and services that may have been 23 incurred by the house of delegates and not included in 24 the appropriation bill, for bills for services and supplies incurred in preparation for the opening of the session 25 26 and after adjournment, and for the necessary operation of the house of dclegates' offices, the requisitions for 27 28 which are to be accompanied by bills to be filed with the 29 auditor.

30 The Speaker of the House of Delegatos, upon approval 31 of the house committee on rules, shall have authority to 32 employ such staff personnel during and between sessions of the Legislature as shall be needed, in addition to 33 personnel designated in the house resolution, and the 34 compensation of all personnel shall be as fixed in such 35 house resolution for the session, or fixed by the speaker, 36 with the approval of the house committee on rules, 37 during and between sessions of the Legislature, 38 39 notwithstanding such house resolution. The Clerk of the House of Delegatcs is hereby authorized to draw 40 requisitions upon the auditor for such services, payable 41

42 out of the appropriation for the Compensation and Per
43 Diem of Officers and Employees or Current Expenses
44 and Contingent Fund of the house of delegates.

For duties imposed by law and by the house of 45 delegates, including salary allowed by law as keeper of 46 47 the rolls, the Clerk of the House of Delegates shall be paid a monthly salary as provided in the house 48 49 resolution, unless increased between sessions under the authority of the speaker, with the approval of the house 50 committee on rules, and payable out of the appropriation 51 for Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and 52Employees or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of 53 54 the house of delegates.

**Sec. 8. Awards for claims against the state.**—There are hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2009, from the fund as designated, in the amounts as specified, general revenue funds in the amount of \$1,886,796, special revenue funds in the amount of \$558,413, and state road funds in the amount of \$713,890 for payment of claims against the state.

1 Sec. 9. Special revenue appropriations.-There are 2 hereby appropriated for expenditure during the fiscal 3 year two thousand nine appropriations made by general 4 law from special revenues which are not paid into the state fund as general revenue under the provisions of 5 6 section two, article two, chapter twelve of the code: 7 *Provided*, That none of the money so appropriated by this section shall be available for expenditure except in 8 9 compliance with and in conformity to the provisions of articles two and three, chapter twelve and article two, 10 11 chapter eleven-b of the code, unless the spending unit

has filed with the director of the budget and thelegislative auditor prior to the beginning of each fiscalyear:

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(a) An estimate of the amount and sources of allrevenues accruing to such fund;

(b) A detailed expenditure schedule showing for whatpurposes the fund is to be expended.

1 Sec. 10. State improvement fund appropriations.- $\mathbf{2}$ Bequests or donations of nonpublic funds, received by 3 the governor on behalf of the state during the fiscal year two thousand nine, for the purpose of making studies 4 and recommendations relative to improvements of the 5 6 administration and management of spending units in 7 the executive branch of state government, shall be deposited in the state treasury in a separate account 8 9 therein designated state improvement fund.

10 There are hereby appropriated all moneys so 11 deposited during the fiscal year two thousand nine to be expended as authorized by the governor, for such 12 studies and recommendations which may encompass 13 any problems of organization, procedures, systems, 14 15 functions, powers or duties of a state spending unit in the executive branch, or the betterment of the economic, 16 social, educational, health and general welfare of the 17 18 state or its citizens.

**Sec. 11. Specific funds and collection accounts.**-A fund or collection account which by law is dedicated to a specific use is hereby appropriated in sufficient amount to meet all lawful demands upon the fund or collection account and shall be expended according to the provisions of article three, chapter twelve of the

7 code.

Sec. 12. Appropriations for refunding erroneous
 payment.-Money that has been erroneously paid into
 the state treasury is hereby appropriated out of the fund
 into which it was paid, for refund to the proper person.

5 When the officer authorized by law to collect money 6 for the state finds that a sum has been erroneously paid, 7 he or she shall issue his or her requisition upon the 8 auditor for the refunding of the proper amount. The 9 auditor shall issue his or her warrant to the treasurer 10 and the treasurer shall pay the warrant out of the fund 11 into which the amount was originally paid.

1 Sec. 13. Sinking fund deficiencies.-There is hereby 2 appropriated to the governor a sufficient amount to 3 meet any deficiencies that may arise in the mortgage finance bond insurance fund of the West Virginia 4 5 housing development fund which is under the supervision and control of the municipal bond 6 7 commission as provided by section twenty-b, article 8 eighteen, chapter thirty-one of the code, or in the funds 9 of the municipal bond commission because of the failure 10 of any state agency for either general obligation or revenue bonds or any local taxing district for general 11 12 obligation bonds to remit funds necessary for the payment of interest and sinking fund requirements. The 13 14 governor is authorized to transfer from time to time 15 such amounts to the municipal bond commission as may 16 be necessary for these purposes.

The municipal bond commission shall reimburse the
state of West Virginia through the governor from the
first remittance collected from the West Virginia
housing development fund or from any state agency or

21 local taxing district for which the governor advanced

22 funds, with interest at the rate carried by the bonds for

23 security or payment of which the advance was made.

1 Sec. 14. Appropriations for local governments.-There 2 are hereby appropriated for payment to counties, 3 districts and municipal corporations such amounts as 4 will be necessary to pay taxes due counties, districts and 5 municipal corporations and which have been paid into 6 the treasury:

7 (a) For redemption of lands;

8 (b) By public service corporations;

9 (c) For tax forfeitures.

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**Sec. 15. Total appropriations.-**Where only a total sum is appropriated to a spending unit, the total sum shall include personal services, annual increment, employee benefits, current expenses, repairs and alterations, equipment and capital outlay, where not otherwise specifically provided and except as otherwise provided in TITLE I-GENERAL PROVISIONS, Sec. 3.

1 Sec. 16. General school fund.-The balance of the 2 proceeds of the general school fund remaining after the 3 payment of the appropriations made by this act is 4 appropriated for expenditure in accordance with 5 section sixteen, article nine-a, chapter eighteen of the 6 code.

#### TITLE III-ADMINISTRATION.

**Section 1.** Appropriations conditional.-The expenditure of the appropriations made by this act,

conditioned upon the compliance by the spending unit
with the requirements of article two, chapter eleven-b
of the code.

8 Where spending units or parts of spending units have 9 been absorbed by or combined with other spending 10 units, it is the intent of this act that appropriations and 11 reappropriations shall be to the succeeding or later 12 spending unit created, unless otherwise indicated.

1 Sec. 2. Constitutionality.-If any part of this act is 2 declared unconstitutional by a court of competent 3 jurisdiction, its decision shall not affect any portion of 4 this act which remains, but the remaining portion shall 5 be in full force and effect as if the portion declared 6 unconstitutional had never been a part of the act.
