AN ACT to amend and reenact §18-5-32 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to including substitute teaching in the job duties of certain professional educators employed by county boards of education in certain administrative and supervisory positions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18-5-32 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

§18-5-32. Assistant superintendents; directors and supervisors of instruction and other educational activities.

(a) The county board, upon the recommendation of the
 county superintendent, may employ an assistant whose term
 of employment may be not less than one nor more than four
 years: *Provided*, That his or her term may not extend beyond
 that of the incumbent county superintendent.

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6 (b) The board may not employ more than one assistant for7 each two hundred teachers or major fraction thereof.

8 (c) The county board, upon the recommendation of the 9 county superintendent, is authorized to employ general and 10 special supervisors or directors of instruction and of other 11 educational activities as may be considered necessary.

(d) The employment of the assistant superintendent shall
be on a twelve-month basis. The period of employment for
all others named herein shall be at the discretion of the
county board.

16 (e) Rules for qualifications of assistant superintendents, 17 and directors and supervisors of instruction and of other 18 educational activities shall be fixed by the state board: 19 Provided, That the qualifications required for any assistant 20 superintendent may not be higher than those required for the 21 county superintendent: Provided, however, That the rules do 22 not affect the status of any incumbent nor his or her right to 23 succeed himself or herself in his or her assigned position.

24 (f) The county board is authorized to reimburse the
25 employees for their necessary traveling expenses upon
26 presentation of a monthly, itemized, sworn statement
27 approved by the county superintendent.

(g) Any person employed under the foregoing provision
of this section, provided he or she holds a valid teacher's
certificate, shall be given continuing contract status as a
teacher and shall hold that status unless dismissed for
statutory reasons.

33 (h) The job duties of a professional educator employed
34 under the provisions of this section, including a professional
aducator employed as a "supervisor" or "central office
administrator" as defined in section one, article one, chapter

37 cighteen-a of this code, shall include substitute teaching on at
38 least three instructional days each school year: *Provided*,
39 That the substitute teaching requirement of this subsection
40 does not apply to the superintendent and those who have
41 never held a teaching certificate or an administrative
42 certificate.

43 (i) All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this section44 arc hereby repealed.
