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1 AN ACT to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding a new section,
2 designated §18-9F-9a, relating to Alyssa's law; requiring the West Virginia Board of
3 Education in conjunction with the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency
4 Management to promulgate a rule permitting all public schools in the state to implement a
5 wearable panic alert system device contingent on available funding; specifying
6 requirements and county board authority relating to the wearable panic alert system
7 device; requiring all security data within a school facility to be accessible by a local law-
8 enforcement agency; creating the Alyssa Alhadeff School Safety Fund; making
9 expenditures from the fund available for the implementation of mobile panic buttons and
10 similar school safety equipment; and sunseting Alyssa's law by December 31, 2029.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 9F. SCHOOL ACCESS SAFETY ACT.

§18-9F-9a. Wearable panic alert system, "Alyssa's law".

1 (a) The state board in conjunction with the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency
2 Management shall promulgate by December 31, 2026, a legislative rule in accordance with §29A-
3 3B-1 *et seq.* of this code, and if necessary may promulgate an emergency rule in accordance with
4 that article, permitting a wearable panic alert system device to be implemented at every public
5 school in the state contingent upon available funding. Each county board may apply to the West
6 Virginia Department of Homeland Security for funding from the fund created pursuant to §18-9F-
7 9a(f) of this section. This section shall be known as Alyssa's law.

8 (b) Each wearable panic alert system device shall be capable of integrating with local
9 public safety answering point infrastructure to transmit 9-1-1 calls and mobile activations and
10 initiating a campus-wide lockdown notification.

11 (c) Each county board may provide each school employee in a school facility with a
12 wearable panic alert device that allows for immediate contact with local emergency response
13 agencies.

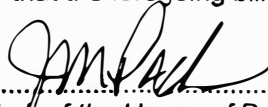
14 (d) Prior to the first day of school each year, each county board shall ensure that all school
15 facility personnel who utilize the wearable panic alert devices receive training on the protocol for
16 and appropriate use of the panic alert device.

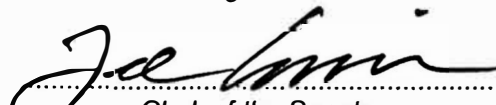
17 (e) Each county board shall ensure that all security data within a school facility is
18 accessible by a local law-enforcement agency and coordinate with the local law-enforcement
19 agency to establish appropriate access protocols. Accessible security data includes cameras,
20 maps, and access control.

21 (f) The Alyssa Alhadeff School Safety Fund is hereby created within the Treasury of the
22 State. The fund shall be administered by the West Virginia Department of Homeland Security and
23 shall consist of all monies from any source, including, but not limited to, all fees, gifts, grants,
24 bequests, or transfers from any source. Expenditures from the fund shall be available for the
25 implementation of mobile panic buttons and similar school safety equipment.

26 (g) The provisions of this section shall sunset by December 31, 2029.

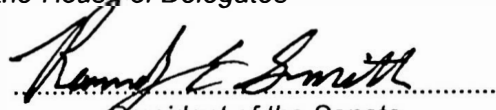
